• If a research proposal contains proprietary information, it should be properly marked in at the time the proposal is submitted. The SF-424 documents has a place to indicate that proprietary information is included in the Research & Related Other Project Information form.

- IT IS NOT APPROPRIATE TO MARK AN ENTIRE PROPOSAL PROPRIETARY.
- Myths abound that marking a proposal proprietary reduce chances of a proposal being funded. These myths are false.
- The benefit of marking a proposal proprietary are ensure the information is treated as confidential and that no bar dates are prematurely created if the narrative includes data that may disclose information about a patentable invention.
